



Lindsay Leigh Kimmett was an athlete, a learner, a leader and an aspiring doctor with all the skills and ambition to leave a big mark on the world.

Since her tragic passing on February 17, 2008, her family members and friends have banded together to continue her legacy through the Lindsay Leigh Kimmett Memorial Foundation.

To date, more than \$200,000 has been invested into the community in Lindsay's name. Current initiatives include:

- Support of amateur sports programs and facilities, including nearly \$160,000 donated to the Spray Lake Sawmills Family Sports Centre expansion project as a result of the first and second Monumental Tournament of Aces
- Support of Arts & Culture Cochrane, the beneficiary of this year's tournament
- Valedictorian scholarships at Cochrane High School, Bow Valley High School and St. Timothy High School
- Annual Dr. Lindsay Leigh Kimmett Prize in Emergency Medicine at the University of Calgary
- Covering equipment and registration costs for deserving skaters through the "Lindsay's Kids" minor hockey sponsorships
- Funding for medical equipment for the University of Calgary Medical School and local hospitals
- Purchase and installation of concrete benches and picnic tables, plus other upgrades, at Mitford Park as a result of two Kimmett Cup co-ed pond hockey tournaments
- Donation to the Red Cross to aid Haiti relief efforts

Through this foundation we hope to carry on a legacy that Lindsay was destined to leave. We thank you for your compassion, consideration and help.
